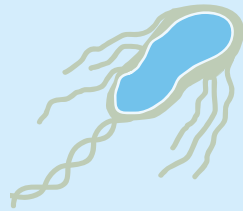
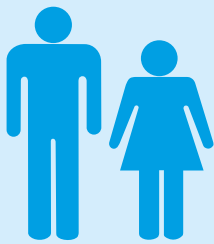


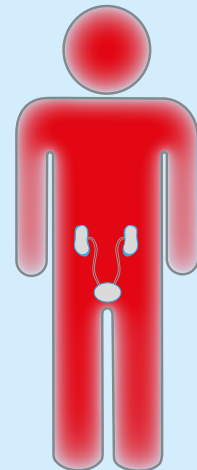
Escherichia coli Bacteraemia



E. COLI IS THE MOST COMMON PATHOGEN CAUSING BACTERAEMIA IN COMMUNITY AND HEALTHCARE SETTINGS. BACTERAEMIA DEVELOPS USUALLY AS A COMPLICATION OF OTHER INFECTIONS, INCLUDING UTIs AND THE USE OF MEDICAL DEVICES INCLUDING URINARY CATHETER DEVICES.



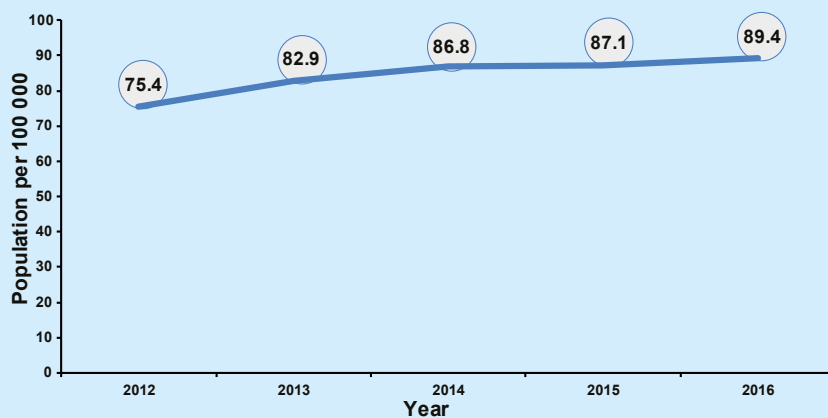

ANNUAL INCIDENCE RATE OF *E. COLI* BACTERAEMIA PER 100 000 POPULATION

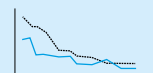
ANNUAL RATE TREND
